MOBILE ANEROID STAND WITH CUFFS \$550 1 needed
HOSPITAL: Singleton Hospital Emergency Department

This manual mobile blood pressure machine will be used across the emergency department to assess and monitor paediatric patients that are being cared for. This piece consists of reusable blood pressure cuffs in different sizes to allow all patients to be monitored with age appropriate equipment.

HANDHELD OXIMETER \$1,200 2 needed
HOSPITAL: Tamworth Children's Ward

The handheld oximeter is used to monitor oxygen levels in children and babies. It is used to detect deterioration, prompting immediate treatment to prevent damage to vital organs.



RAD5 PORTABLE PULSE OXIMETER WITH FINGER SENSOR \$1,640 1 needed
HOSPITAL: Muswellbrook Emergency Department

This portable, lightweight handheld device is used to monitor vital signs. It quickly, accurately and noninvasively measures oxygen saturation levels and pulse rate. It is ideal for monitoring children during transfers allowing early detection of any deterioration in their condition, prompting immediate treatment.




LOW FLOW MICROBLENDER WITH POLEMOUNT: \$3,320 4 needed
HOSPITALS: Armidale Paediatric (2) Tamworth Children's Ward (2)

This piece of equipment delivers oxygen in a precise and adjustable manner. It is essential in the treatment of sick babies and children who require extra oxygen to help with their breathing. The pole mount allows it to be attached to other resuscitation equipment where it is easily accessible and fully utilised.



MR850 RESPIRATORY HUMIDIFIER: \$3,640 4 needed
HOSPITALS: Armidale Rural Referral Hospital Children's Ward (2) & Tamworth Rural Referral Hospital Children's Ward (2)

Humidifiers add heat and moisture to oxygen that is delivered to critically ill babies and children during mechanical ventilation. As their upper airway is bypassed, sick infants are at risk of becoming very cold. Humidifiers help prevent the build up of thick airway secretions which can block breathing tubes and destruct the lining of the airways or even collapse little lungs. It has been proven that when oxygen is humidified infants will recover faster.



VITAL SIGNS MONITOR \$6,100 1 needed
HOSPITAL: Tamworth Rural Referral Hospital Accident & Emergency Ward

This monitor with neonatal and paediatric attachments will assist in prompt and vital monitoring of children presented to the Accident and Emergency Ward. Currently their Emergency Department is lacking monitoring devices that can quickly and accurately provide medical staff with vital signs statistics. This monitor provides blood pressure, temperature and pulse both routine assessments and ongoing monitoring in a non invasive manor. It enables staff to provide speedy accurate monitoring information allowing them to provide best life-saving treatment.



CONNEX VITAL SIGNS MONITOR: \$6,100 2 needed
HOSPITAL: Glen Innes Children's Ward (1) & Emergency Department (1)

This advanced easy to use wall mounted monitor measures pulse, temperature, blood pressure and oxygen saturation which are needed for the treatment and stabilisation of sick children. It acts as two devices in one, with the ability to spot check and also monitor whilst providing comprehensive patient documentation and data protection ensuring the highest level of patient care.



BROSELOW PAEDIATRIC CART: \$5,000 1 needed
HOSPITAL: Walcha District Emergency Department

The Broselow Paediatric Code Cart is used to improve the accessibility of appropriately sized equipment by staff during respiratory or cardiac emergencies in children. The trolley has different coloured drawers that are for different sized children, from babies to young adolescents. This means that it is faster and safer for the staff to locate the correct sized equipment in an emergency.

Walcha District Hospital is a small rural hospital that has identified that this trolley would have helped them enormously in a recent situation they had there. It will be invaluable to the care of small children.



GIRAFFE WARMER: \$31,200 1 needed
HOSPITAL: Tamworth Special Care Nursery

This equipment provides uninterrupted thermal support for premature and sick babies while at the same time giving medical staff complete access and visibility for procedures such as x-ray, examinations or even surgery. It has integrated resuscitation and oxygen support to ensure a baby does not have to be moved if they need to be resuscitated.
